What information we collect, use, and why

We collect or use the following information to **provide services, Information, Reviews, Research and Analysis and third-party referrals,**

- Photographs or video recordings
- Audio Recordings
- Information about life, government, community, environment, work, home and living conditions.
- News and Updates
- Research papers and Literature.

We collect or use the following personal information **for research and analysis:**

- Photographs and Video, CCTV recordings of public areas (including indoor and outdoor spaces)
- Audio recordings of public areas (including indoor and outdoor spaces)
- Information relating to communities.
- Information relating to health and safety.
- Information relating to Local Authority
- Information relating to Private Service Providers and Companies

We collect or use the following personal information for **research or archiving purposes**:

- Recorded images, such as Photos or Videos or Audio or Written / Printed Literature

We also collect or use the following information for **research or archiving purposes**:

- Political opinions
- Company and Business Details
- Professional and Tradesperson's Details
- Local Authority and Government Information
- Local Community Articles and Historic Writings and Literature

We collect or use the following personal information to **comply with legal requirements**:

- Health and safety information
- Criminal Acts and Antisocial Behaviours
- Local and National Archives
- News / Media Articles

Lawful bases and data protection rights

Under UK data protection law, we must have a “lawful basis” for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible lawful bases in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO’s website.

Which lawful basis we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are in brief set out below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO’s website:

- **Your right of access** - You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get personal information from and who we share personal information with. There are some exemptions which means you may not receive all the information you ask for. [You can read more about this right here.](#)
- **Your right to rectification** - You have the right to ask us to correct or delete personal information you think is inaccurate or incomplete. [You can read more about this right here.](#)
- **Your right to erasure** - You have the right to ask us to delete your personal information. [You can read more about this right here.](#)

- Scotland’s Future and Scottish Peoples Freedom
- Protecting Scottish People

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information for **research or archiving purposes** are:

- • Legitimate interests – we’re collecting or using your information because it benefits you, our organization, communities, or someone else, without causing an undue risk of harm to anyone. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to portability. Our legitimate interests are:

- Scotland’s Interests and Scot’s Freedom

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information to **comply with legal requirements** are:

- • Legitimate interests – we’re collecting or using your information because it benefits you, our organization, communities, or someone else, without causing an undue risk of harm to anyone. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to portability. Our legitimate interests are:
 - To progress the cause of Scottish Independence
 - To provide Scots with a safe and prosperous future.

Where we get personal information from

- Directly from you, others and third parties
- CCTV footage, Photographs, Video, Audio, or other recordings
- Publicly available sources

How long we keep information.

Indefinitely if required or will be destroyed after 12 months.

Archive – Data stored for a period before destruction dependent on need.

Who we share information with

Others we share personal information with

- Publicly on our website, social media or other persons with similar interests or concerns and information media.

How to complain
